## Navy's economic impact in Hampton Roads exceeds \$15.4 billion

**NORFOLK, Va.** – The Navy spent more than \$15.4 billion in Hampton Roads during the 2019 fiscal year, or about \$600 million less than the previous year, according to an economic impact report released by Navy Region Mid-Atlantic today.

The decline was primarily the result of a decrease in spending for the procurement of goods and services at the region's six naval installations, including construction, maintenance and repair.

Several large projects were completed in the 2018 fiscal year, including the refurbishment of a pier onboard Naval Station Norfolk to accommodate Ford-class aircraft carriers and the construction of a new pier at Norfolk Naval Shipyard that can simultaneously accommodate the repair and maintenance of two aircraft carriers or a combination of other vessels.

The annual report covers economic activity from Oct. 1, 2018 through Sept. 30, 2019. While overall spending in FY19 declined from the previous year, it still represents a nearly \$1.3 billion increase over the 2017 fiscal year.

"This report shows the Navy continues to be a major economic driver in Hampton Roads that provides meaningful employment for uniformed personnel and civilians while also supporting private businesses throughout the region," said Rear Adm. Charles W. Rock, Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic.

The number of ships and aircraft squadrons based in the region remained steady. There was a decline of about 10,000 military family members, but the military retiree and survivor population increased by about 1,300.

"Service members are choosing to come back to Hampton Roads or stay here once they retire because of the incredible support and quality of life the local community offers our veterans," Rock said. "Our Sailors are highly talented and driven. Many of them will start second careers in the private sector and volunteer in their communities as they continue to serve. There's no better place to live than right here in Hampton Roads, America's Navy town."

The FY19 statistical report captures the amount of direct capital spent as a result of salaries, expenditures and contractual payments for services rendered in support of installation activities. Due to the transient nature of military personnel, associated supporting civilian staff, and family members, population numbers are in constant fluctuation. Population numbers reflected in this report are considered a reasonable estimate.
