Navy's economic impact in Hampton Roads nearly \$15.8 billion as global pandemic took hold

NORFOLK, Va. – The Navy spent nearly \$15.8 billion in Hampton Roads during the 2020 fiscal year, or about \$650 million less than the previous year, according to an economic impact report released by Navy Region Mid-Atlantic today.

The decline was primarily due to a decrease in spending for the procurement of goods and services at the region's six naval installations, including construction, maintenance and repair.

The report shows there was also reduced spending on civilian contractors and non-appropriated fund civilian employees, in part, due to the coronavirus pandemic.

Non-appropriated fund civilian employees perform jobs that are primarily funded from revenue generated from sources other than Congress, such as from the sale of meals and entertainment. Some businesses on installations closed or operated on reduced hours during much of the pandemic.

The annual report covers economic activity from Oct. 1, 2019 through Sept. 30, 2020. The report also includes updated figures for the 2019 fiscal year and additional information.

While overall spending decreased, the report shows the military-connected population in the area remained steady at about 279,000 people, while the number of ships and aircraft squadrons also did not change.

"This report shows that even during a global pandemic, the Navy is a source of economic stability in Hampton Roads," said Rear Adm. Charles Rock, Commander, Navy Region Mid-Atlantic. "We were able to take extra health and safety precautions to keep our personnel and our community safe, while also adapting to keep our ships sailing and our aircraft flying so they could continue to do the nation's business where they're needed, when they're needed."

Spending on travel-related costs increased by about \$25 million because some Sailors were put into a restriction of movement status to help stop the spread of the virus, which required temporary housing and meals.

The FY20 statistical report captures the amount of direct capital spent as a result of salaries, expenditures and contractual payments for services rendered in support of installation activities. Due to the transient nature of military personnel, associated support civilian staff, and family members, population numbers are in constant fluctuation. Population numbers reflected in this report are considered a reasonable estimate.
