Fleet Week New York Kicks off with Parade of Ships

NORFOLK, VA (Navy Region Mid-Atlantic) – Fleet Week New York (FWNY) has been held nearly every year since 1984 and this year's theme is "Honoring the Past, Defending the Future: 250 Years of Sea Service Excellence." It celebrates the rich history of the sea services, honoring service members from the past, present, and future who play a crucial role in supporting the fleet while carrying out our Navy and Marine Corps' maritime strategy and strategic objectives. This year, FWNY begins Wednesday, May 21, with a ceremonial parade of ships passing by the Statue of Liberty, Fort Hamilton, and One World Trade Center, from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. This year's parade of ships will include vessels from the U.S. Navy, U.S. Coast Guard, U.S. Naval Academy, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Canadian Navy and Fire Department New York.

- USCGC Hawser (WYTL 65610) 65-foot small harbor tug stationed in Bayonne, New Jersey
- Five U.S. Naval Academy yard patrol crafts (YPs) from Annapolis, Maryland

Ships can be seen along the Hudson River from Battery Park to just south of the George Washington Bridge. Fort Hamilton is scheduled to conduct an 11-gun salute, called Salute to the Ships of Fleet Week, to the flagship, USS New York, as the ship passes by. Passing of the ships during the Parade of Ships will also be live streamed from a helicopter and shared to the Fleet Week New York Facebook page at Facebook: <u>@FleetWeekNewYork</u>.

FWNY will take place May 21 - 27 and will include general public ship tours, aviation demonstrations, military band performances, and interactive displays throughout the tri-state area. Please note: Canadian Navy Harry DeWolf-class offshore patrol vessel HMCS Frédérick Rolette (AOPV 434) will not be available for tours.

Visitors should plan to wear comfortable clothing and shoes. All bags and/or camera cases will be searched prior to entering. Ships are considered an industrial environment and guests should avoid open-toed sandals, high heels, necklaces, or other items that can get caught, as well as bags that are too heavy to carry comfortably.

There is no age requirement to tour ships during FWNY, however, adult visitors over the age of 18 are required to show a valid state or federally issued ID. Additionally, tours may not be appropriate for young children or those with certain medical conditions. Strollers or baby carriages are permitted on the pier but are not allowed on the ships.

Ships are not handicap accessible, however, the pier facilities in Manhattan and Staten Island, including the exhibit area, are handicap accessible.

The following items are not permitted: electronic smoking devices; bottles, water bottles, cans or glass containers of any type; banners, posters or signs of any type; mace, pepper spray, or other defensive sprays or chemicals; knives, firearms, fireworks or any explosive; illegal drugs or paraphernalia; flammable liquids or aerosol spray cans; club weapons; and animals. All electronic devices are subject to examination for functionality. Military services reserve the right to prohibit other items not listed above.

All ship tours are free and open to the public.
