Starting January 6th, 2026, the Navy and its representatives will begin tree mitigation in the City of Norfolk's Rights of Way. This will include the removal of trees followed by the replanting of trees.

- You may observe the tree removal performed in various stages from branch and limb cutting, chipping, and removal followed by trunk cutting and removal, sometimes with the use of cranes.
- The stumps will be ground below grade, and the area will be repaired and seeded. The duration of the entire process will vary by site due to numerous factors including number of trees, access, weather, etc.

This project will begin at the intersection of West Bayview Boulevard and Executive Drive. We will then move west and head south toward Culfor Crescent Road. The work in the neighborhood will last for 3 months and progress will be contingent on various factors such as unforeseen issues below grade or weather.
