Naval Weapons Station Earle is a 12,000 acre ordnance storage, transport and handling facility supporting all Navy Atlantic Fleet Carrier and Expeditionary Strike Groups. The installation is also the operational support base for five Military Sealift Command cargo/ammunition ships and provides host services and security for over 1,500 personnel.
